Invasive species control: Our target species is black mustard. The plants are young and small and the soil is moist, so they should be easy to pull up roots and all. They plants are low to the ground (4"-6" high), so you may prefer to bring knee pads or gardener pad, or something to sit on, like a small pillow in a plastic bag, but not necessary. A narrow hand tool, like a garden knife may be useful, but right now the soil is moist and the plants pull up easily. Bring work gloves if you have them. Some tools and gloves will be provided. The terrain is sloped, so shoes with good traction are recommended. Long pants are best. Dress for the weather. There will be no shade, so sun protection is important. Please do not bring pets as they are a distraction from the work at hand.

Meet at the Fontaine Street Entrance to the Open Space. There is plenty of street parking between the Bay Area Technology School and the Oakland Academy of Knowledge.
