OAKLAND RECEIVES CAL FIRE GRANT FOR VEGETATION WORK IN JOAQUIN MILLER PARK

Recently Dale Risden, Chair of Friends of Joaquin Miller Park (FOJMP), shared this great news:

"I'm happy to be able to confirm that Oakland has received a Cal Fire Grant to do work outlined in Oakland's Vegetative Plan for Joaquin Miller Park. Focus will be on Joaquin Miller Rd., Skyline JMP side, Sanborn, and area around Arena. ...

Members of Cal Fire Team for FOJMP, along with members from FOSC, and Oakland Tree Services, along with a crew of thirty Cal Fire crew hiked along Sanborn to get a feel for the work. FOSC is going to mark out areas where sensitive vegetation exist. This will not be overly extensive. But overgrowth and many invasive low materials will be mulched in place. This is a huge win for Fire Safety, a healthier Park, and help residents from losing fire insurance coverage. They will be starting immediately and will be here till May!

Cal Fire let us know that it was our efforts in seeking Cal Fire Grants that got Cal Fire to approach Oakland. A win win for everyone! Keep you posted."

FOSC has taken on the role of biological monitoring as the crews remove fuel load, flagging native plants that could be affected by tree removal or mulching, with particular attention to rare plant areas.


NESTING SEASON IS APPROACHING

The purpose is to help homeowners lessen the potential for damage to their houses during an earthquake by "bracing" the crawl space, when necessary, and "bolting" the foundation to the house's frame. In addition
