




UPDATE: MAKE OAKLAND WILDFIRE SAFE

City of Oakland Awarded \$1 Million Cal Fire Grant


Latest CAL FIRE Grant will support ongoing effort to remove hazardous dead and dying trees along key evacuation routes

Oakland, CA – The City of Oakland has been notified by the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire) that it will be awarded a \$1 Million grant to fund its "Shepherd Canyon to Grass Valley Evacuation Route" project. The Cal Fire California Climate Investments (CCI) Wildfire Prevention Grant application was developed jointly by the City's Public Works Department and the Oakland Fire Department to fund ongoing vegetation management and emergency planning work along key evacuation routes in the city's high fire hazard severity zone (see photo). **READ MORE** of the

The *Emergency Preparedness Guide and Toolkit* was developed by the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), the California Department of Rehabilitation (DOR), and the California Department of Aging (CDA). This guide provides information that people with disabilities and older adults can use to increase readiness before, during, and after disasters. SEE GUIDE



California's worst destructive wildfires were only three years ago and can quickly change due to new growth of vegetation that is fuel for wildfires. Stay prepared and ready to evacuate in the event of a wildfire or other disasters such as floods and earthquakes.

- 1. Discuss with family on where to meet if cannot return home
- 2. Prepare an emergency supply kit with essentials
- 3. Familiarize yourself with Red Flag Warning and how to get weather reports
- 4. Evacuate early when fire or disaster is present
