

MEASURE MM ASKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT

Volunteers are knocking on doors and talking with registered voters in Oakland's Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone; they will be



receiving their ballots next week and voting on Measure MM that provides resources to the City of Oakland to make the area safer from wildfire, clearing evacuation routes of brush, dead and dying trees for 100 feet.

Increased resources will enhance Oakland's current efforts by raising \$2.67 million that will be restricted to the improved wildfire efforts—more goats and more attention to our parks.

67% of the votes in favor is needed for this special tax to pass, so anyone who thinks it's a good idea is invited to get involved. Learn more about the measure and the various ways to get involved on the. **WEBSITE**
