OFSC MEETS THE CARBONATOR






We took a field trip to meet the machine helping to reduce fire hazards in Anthony Chabot Regional Park

"A new climate-conscious machine is helping reduce excess and dead vegetation in East Bay parks. The machine is called a carbonator and is capable of turning as much as 80 tons of trees and shrubs into biochar in a matter of several hours. The biochar—a mostly carbon substance created by burning organic material in an oxygen-limited environment—can then be spread around the land to improve soil quality." LEARN MORE


